Have your say on Bristol's Temple Island

Legal & General is progressing plans for the soon to be vibrant district at Temple Island.

The new development will bring significant benefits to the city and its communities, with investment in new jobs and homes, as well as considerable social and environmental benefits.

A showcase of the emerging plans will be touring the city this autumn, giving you an opportunity to have your say on the emerging plans.

Following feedback in the spring we have been working to decide where buildings will go and what size they could be. We want to know what you think about this.

We've also been thinking about how the public areas will look and be used - planting, hard landscaping and how people will access and move through the space. We also want to know what you think about this.

The next stage is to work out how the buildings will look. After considering feedback from this stage we'll be engaging again later this year to ask people what they think about the design of the buildings.

An initial round of public engagement was held in the spring and Legal & General is continuing to work with the local community to make sure the plans are right for Bristol.

Summer 2024 onwards Continued community engagement




Spring 2026 Construction begins on phase 1

The emerging plans

Located close to a new eastern entrance to Bristol Temple Meads railway station and the communities south of the Avon New Cut, Temple Island will be a part of the wider Temple Quarter regeneration area.




- Connectivity is important for cycling, walking and motorists, particularly when it comes to congestion and creating access to and from the Bath Road/A4 and Temple Meads station.
 - Walking and cycling will be prioritised with new connections from the Bath Road (1a) and existing bridges (1b and 1c). Vehicle access will be from the Brocks Bridge (1c).
- Biodiversity and sustainability is important. We are looking at tree planting and habitat creation in new green spaces as well as ensuring the new buildings are designed in a way that allows people to live and work sustainably.
- People want to see this site made best use of. The **heights and** layout we're proposing at this stage maximise the use of this site in a way that benefits Bristol.

- Affordable homes are important so the new community provides the homes Bristol needs. Four new buildings with homes of different types will include up to 40% affordable homes.
- Flexible spaces are key for the integration of different groups across the city. We're looking at how this building can best serve the community.
- A hotel and conference centre to support Bristol's visitor economy.
- Any new **office space** must be suitable for Bristol the two new office buildings will be carefully designed to respond to modern workplace needs.

Bath Road connection
